## RHODE ISLAND SPCA RESPONDS TO APARTMENT WITH 20 RABBITS 3 WEEKS AFTER TAKING CUSTODY OF 32 GUINEA PIGS

[Riverside, Rhode Island, March 10, 2023] — The Rhode Island SPCA responded to a home in Cranston this week after receiving a call to relinquish upwards of 15 rabbits. Upon arriving at the scene, 20 rabbits were found stacked in dog crates living in deplorable living conditions. Cranston Animal Control assisted in seizing some of the rabbits, however a majority were taken to the SPCA's headquarters in Riverside. Many are currently undergoing medical treatment and receiving necessary veterinary care. Some are scheduled to be spayed and neutered next week and hopefully be made available for adoption in the near future. Charges are being pressed against the former owners and they are scheduled to appear in court, Monday 3/13.
